

## Key Information Document KRC Cat Bond UCITS ETF (the **Fund**), a sub-fund of HANetf II ICAV Accumulating ETF Share Class

This document provides you with key information about this investment Fund. It is not marketing material. The information is required by law to help you understand the nature, risks, costs, potential gains and losses of this Fund and to help you compare it with other funds.

### What is this Fund?

<b>Type</b>	<p>The Fund is a sub-fund of HANetf II ICAV (the <b>ICAV</b>), an open-ended Irish collective asset-management vehicle umbrella fund with segregated liability between sub-funds, with variable capital established under the laws of Ireland and authorised by the Central Bank under the UCITS Regulation 2011, as amended.</p> <p>The investment objective of the Fund is to achieve long term investment returns by primarily investing in a portfolio of catastrophe bonds (Cat Bonds) that may have the potential to generate income and capital preservation.</p> <p>Under normal circumstances, the Fund will invest at least 80% of its net assets in Cat Bonds. Cat Bonds are financial instruments that allow insurers and reinsurers to transfer specific risks, typically those associated with trigger events related to natural disasters or other perils, such as hurricanes, earthquakes, tsunamis, tornadoes, wildfires, floods, cybercrime and plane crashes to capital markets investors (the Trigger Event(s)).</p> <p>In order for a Trigger Event to be deemed to have occurred, three criteria must be satisfied while the bond is outstanding: an event; a geographic area in which the event must occur; and a threshold of economic or physical loss caused by the event, together with a method to measure such loss.</p>
<b>Objectives and Policies</b>	<p>The Fund has no limit as to the types of natural catastrophes, geographic areas or thresholds of loss referenced by Cat Bonds in which it can invest. Within each natural peril and geographic region, the Fund seeks to diversify exposures to underlying insurance and reinsurance carriers, trigger types and lines of business.</p> <p>While most of the Cat Bonds the Fund invests in will have Trigger Events that are natural catastrophes, as described above, some Trigger Events may be non-natural catastrophes, such as cybercrime, plane crashes or other events resulting in a specified level of physical or economic loss, such as mortality or longevity (life-span). The Fund will not invest greater than 10% of its net assets in Cat Bonds which have non-natural Trigger Events.</p> <p>The Fund may invest in ancillary liquid assets and money market instruments which may include bank deposits, certificates of deposit, commercial paper, floating rate notes and freely transferable promissory notes. In addition, for liquidity and efficient portfolio management purposes, the Fund may invest up to 10% of its net assets in short-dated investment grade corporate and/or government bonds with maturities not exceeding two years.</p>

<b>Additional Information</b>	<p>Shares of the Fund are listed on one or more stock exchanges. Typically, only authorised participants (i.e., brokers) can purchase Shares from or sell Shares back to the Fund. Other investors can purchase and sell shares on exchange on each day the relevant stock exchange is open.</p> <p>Income received by the Fund's investments will not be distributed in respect of the shares of this class. <b>Term</b>	The Fund has no minimum fixed term, although the recommended holding period is 5 years. Termination of the Fund is only possible in those cases expressly provided for in the Prospectus or Supplement of the Fund.
<b>Intended retail investor</b>	The Fund is intended to be offered to retail investors who are seeking capital growth over the long term. An investment should only be made by those persons who are able to sustain a loss on their investment. Typical investors in the Fund are expected to be investors who want to take exposure to the markets covered by the Fund's investment policy and are prepared to accept the risks associated with an investment of this type, including the volatility of such market.

## What are the risks and what could I get in return?

### Summary Risk Indicator



The risk indicator assumes you keep the Fund for 5 years. The actual risk can vary significantly if you cash in at an early stage and you may get back less.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this Fund compared to other funds. It shows how likely it is that the Fund will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you. We have classified this product as 3 out of 7, which is a medium-low risk class. This rates the potential losses from future performance at a medium-low level, and poor market conditions are unlikely to impact the Fund's capacity to pay you.

**Be aware of currency risk. The Fund invests in securities denominated in currencies other than its base currency. Changes in the exchange rates may adversely affect the performance of the Fund. This risk is not considered in the indicator shown above.**

The Fund does not include any protection from future market performance so you could lose some or all of your investment. Investment by the Fund in other collective investment schemes, emerging markets and use of derivatives may involve additional risks. ### Performance Scenarios

What you will get from this Fund depends on future market performance. Market developments in the future are uncertain and cannot be accurately predicted. The unfavourable, moderate, and favourable scenarios shown are illustrations using the worst, average, and best performance of the Fund over the last 10 years. The scenarios shown are illustrations based on results from the past and on certain assumptions.

The figures shown include all the costs of the Fund itself but may not include all the costs that you pay to your advisor or distributor/and includes the costs of your advisor or distributor. The figures do not take into account your personal tax situation, which may also affect how much you get back. Due to market risk exposure, you can lose some or all of the amount invested during the recommended holding period of 5 years.

- **The stress scenario** shows what you might get back in extreme market circumstances.
- **Unfavourable scenario:** This type of scenario occurred for an investment between 09/2024 and 09/2025.
- **Moderate scenario:** This type of scenario occurred for an investment between 01/2016 and 01/2021.
- **Favourable Scenario:** This type of scenario occurred for an investment between 03/2020 and 03/2025.

### What happens if HANetf Management Limited is unable to pay out?

HANetf Management Limited, as PRIIPS manufacturer of the Fund, is not obliged to make any payment in relation to the Fund, such obligations being those of the Fund itself. The assets of the Fund are kept separately from those of the Manager. An insolvency or default of the Manager should not result in the Fund suffering any financial loss in relation to its assets. The amount the Fund is obliged to pay out is linked to the net assets of the Fund so it is unlikely that the Fund will be unable to pay out unless there is an operational error or an insolvency or default by the Depositary which holds the Fund's assets on its behalf. In the event of the insolvency or default of the Depositary, securities held by the Depositary on behalf of the Fund should be protected but the Fund may suffer loss in relation to cash and certain other assets which are not protected. Investment in the Fund is not covered by any investor protection scheme.

### What are the Costs?

The party advising on or selling you the Fund may charge you other costs. If so, this party will provide you with information about these costs and how they affect your investment.

### Costs over time

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover one-off, ongoing and incidental costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest, how long you hold the Fund and how well the Fund performs. The amounts shown here are illustrations based on an example investment amount and different possible investment periods.

We have assumed:

- In the first year you would get back the amount that you invested (0 % annual return).
- For the other holding periods we have assumed the Fund performs as shown in the moderate scenario.
- USD 10,000 is invested.

## How long should I hold the Fund and can I take my money out early?

The Fund has no required minimum holding period but is designed for longer-term investment, though it is recommended that you stay invested for at least 5 years. Investors are able to sell their investment on any day on which banks are open in the UK. When you cash in or if you switch between sub-funds, there may be a delay of up to 5 days for this Fund. By selling the Fund earlier than the recommended holding period, you may receive back more or less than you would have received if you had stayed invested until the recommended holding period. A redemption or exchange fee of up to 3% may be payable to the Manager by authorised participants in such circumstances. Other Investors, i.e. those who sell shares typically on exchange, may be charged additional fees by their broker. You can make regular and one-off withdrawals. Withdrawals could be greater than any growth achieved and could reduce your investment's value below the amount invested. You should refer to the Prospectus and Supplement for the Fund for the conditions that apply and information on tax.
