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What is this product?

Type: Shares of a Sub-Fund of MULTI UNITS LUXEMBOURG, an Undertaking for Collective Investments in Transferable Securities (UCITS), established as a SICAV.

Term: The term of the Sub-Fund is unlimited. The Management Company may terminate the fund by liquidation or merger with another fund in accordance with legal requirements.

Objectives: The investment objective the Sub-Fund is to track both the upward and the downward evolution of the MSCI World Select Catholic Principles Universal Index (the "**Benchmark Index**") denominated in USD, while minimizing the volatility of the difference between the return of the Sub-Fund and the return of the Benchmark Index (the "**Tracking Error**").

The anticipated level of Tracking Error in normal market conditions is indicated in the prospectus.

The Benchmark Index is an equity index calculated and published by the international index provider MSCI, which features the following characteristics:

1. Same investment universe of securities as the MSCI World Index (The "**Parent Index**"),
2. Exclusion of companies with an MSCI ESG Rating strictly below "BB", involved in controversial businesses, and with a very serious ESG controversy,
3. Exclusion of companies that are involved in Stem Cells, Abortions and Contraceptives and Animal Welfare,
4. Exclusions of Top 20% securities by carbon emission intensity and reduction of potential carbon emissions from fossil fuel reserves by 50%,
5. Weighting by the product of companies' free-float market cap weights in the Parent Index and a Combined ESG Score reflecting an assessment of both the current ESG profile as well as the trend in that profile.

The Sub-Fund promotes environmental and/or social characteristics through among others, replicating an Index integrating an environmental, social and governance ("ESG") rating.

The Index methodology is constructed using a "Best-in-class approach": best ranked companies are selected to construct the Index. "Best-in-class" is an approach where leading or best-performing investments are selected within a universe, industry sector or class. It excludes companies falling behind on an ESG level, particularly based on ESG ratings. Using such Best-in-class approach, the Index follows an extra-financial approach significantly engaging that permits the reduction by at least 20% of the initial investment universe (expressed in number of issuers).

The ESG key issues include for instance, but are not limited to, water stress, carbon emissions, labor management or business ethics.

The prospectus describes limitations of the methodology of the Benchmark Index through risk factors such as risk related to the carbon data used in methodology of the Benchmark Index or lack of reactivity to ESG fundamentals changing circumstances, or Extra Financial risks related to the components of the Benchmark Index.

The Benchmark Index is a net total return index. A net total return index calculates the performance of the Index constituents on the basis that any dividends or distributions are included in the Index returns after withholding tax retention.

The Sub-Fund seeks to achieve its objective via a direct replication, by investing primarily in the securities comprising the Benchmark Index. To optimize the Benchmark Index replication, the Sub-Fund may use a sampling replication strategy. The potential use of this technique is published on the Amundi website: www.amundiETF.com.

In addition, the indicative net asset value is published on the Reuters and Bloomberg pages of the Sub-Fund, and might also be mentioned on the websites of the stock exchanges where the Fund is listed.

Intended Retail Investor: This product is intended for investors, with a basic knowledge of and no or limited experience of investing in funds seeking to increase the value of their investment over the recommended holding period with the ability to bear losses up to the amount invested.

Redemption and Dealing: The Sub-Fund's shares are listed and traded on one or more stock exchanges. In normal circumstances, you may deal in shares during the trading hours of the stock exchanges. Only authorised participants (e.g., selected financial institutions) may deal in shares directly with the Sub-Fund on the primary market. Further details are provided in the MULTI UNITS LUXEMBOURG prospectus.

Distribution policy: As this is a non-distributing share class, investment income is reinvested. the accumulation share automatically retains, and re-invests, all attributable income within the Sub-Fund; thereby accumulating value in the price of the accumulation shares.

What are the risks and what could I get in return?

RISK INDICATOR



The risk indicator assumes you keep the product for 5 years.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movement in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 4 out of 7, which is a medium risk class. This rates the potential losses from future performance at a medium level, and poor market conditions could impact our capacity to pay you.

COSTS OVER TIME

* Secondary Market: because the Sub-Fund is an ETF, Investors who are not Authorized Participants will generally only be able to buy or sell shares on the secondary market. Accordingly, investors will pay brokerage fees and/or transaction costs in connection with their dealings on stock exchange(s). These brokerage fees and/or transaction costs are not charged by, or payable to, the Sub-Fund nor the Management Company but to the investor own intermediary. In addition, the investors may also bear the costs of "bid-ask" spreads; meaning the difference between the prices at which shares can be bought and sold.

Primary Market: Authorized Participants dealing directly with the Fund will pay related primary market transaction costs.

How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

Recommended holding period: 5 years is based on our assessment of the risk and reward characteristics and costs of the Sub-Fund.

This product is designed for medium-term investment; you should be prepared to stay invested for at least 5 years. You can redeem your investment at any time, or hold the investment longer.

Order Schedule: Details of dealing frequency can be found under "What is this product?". Please see the "What are the costs?" section for details of any exit fees.

On the Primary Market the Company may:

- Suspend the redemption of shares, if exceptional circumstances so require, considering the interests of investors.
- Manage liquidity risks, by (i) limiting how many shares are redeemed in a short amount of time if redemption requests reach a predefined threshold beyond which such requests can no longer be executed in the best interests of all investors (“**Gates**”), and (ii) applying anti-dilution tools (anti-dilution levy or partial or full swing pricing) to mitigate material dilution for remaining investors.

On the Secondary Market, investors will generally be able to sell their shares on the relevant stock exchange. Further details can be found in the Prospectus.
