# EURO CREDIT BOND

### Investment objective

The Fund aims to provide long-term capital growth and income by investing in a portfolio of bonds (denominated in Euros), while promoting environmental, social and governance (ESG) characteristics within the meaning of Article 8 of SFDR. The Fund aims to have a higher ESG score than its reference benchmark.



### Investment strategy

The Fund is actively managed and is not constrained by a benchmark. The Fund will mostly invest in Euro denominated investment grade corporate issues whilst reserving the possibility of investing in bonds and similar securities issued or guaranteed by governments, government agencies and supranational bodies. The Fund includes the identification and analysis of an issuer's environmental and social factors and corporate governance practices as an integral part of the investment decision making process. Issuers considered for inclusion within the Fund's portfolio will be subject to excluded activities in accordance with HSBC Asset Management's Responsible Investment Policies, which may change from time to time. The Fund may invest up to 10% in contingent convertible securities, up to 10% in other funds, and may invest in bank deposits and money market instruments for treasury purposes. ### Main risks

- The Fund's unit value can go up as well as down, and any capital invested in the Fund may be at risk.
- The Fund invests in bonds whose value generally falls when interest rates rise. This risk is typically greater the longer the maturity of a bond investment and the higher its credit quality. The issuers of certain bonds, could become unwilling or unable to make payments on their bonds and default. Bonds that are in default may become hard to sell or worthless.
- Investment Leverage occurs when the economic exposure is greater than the amount invested, such as when derivatives are used. A Fund that employs leverage may experience greater gains and/or losses due to the amplification effect from a movement in the price of the reference source.

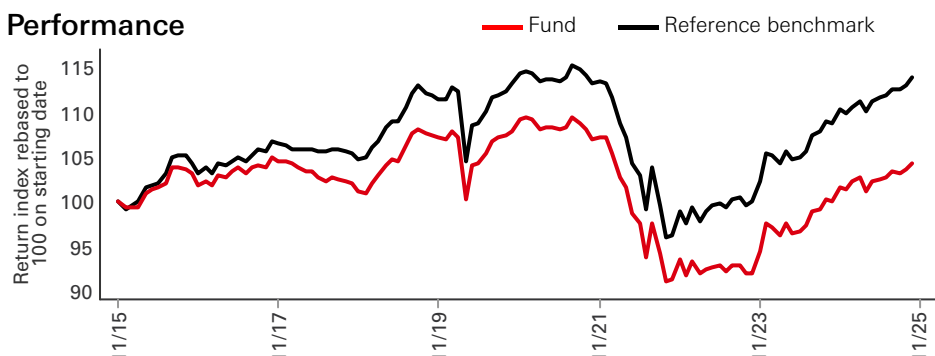

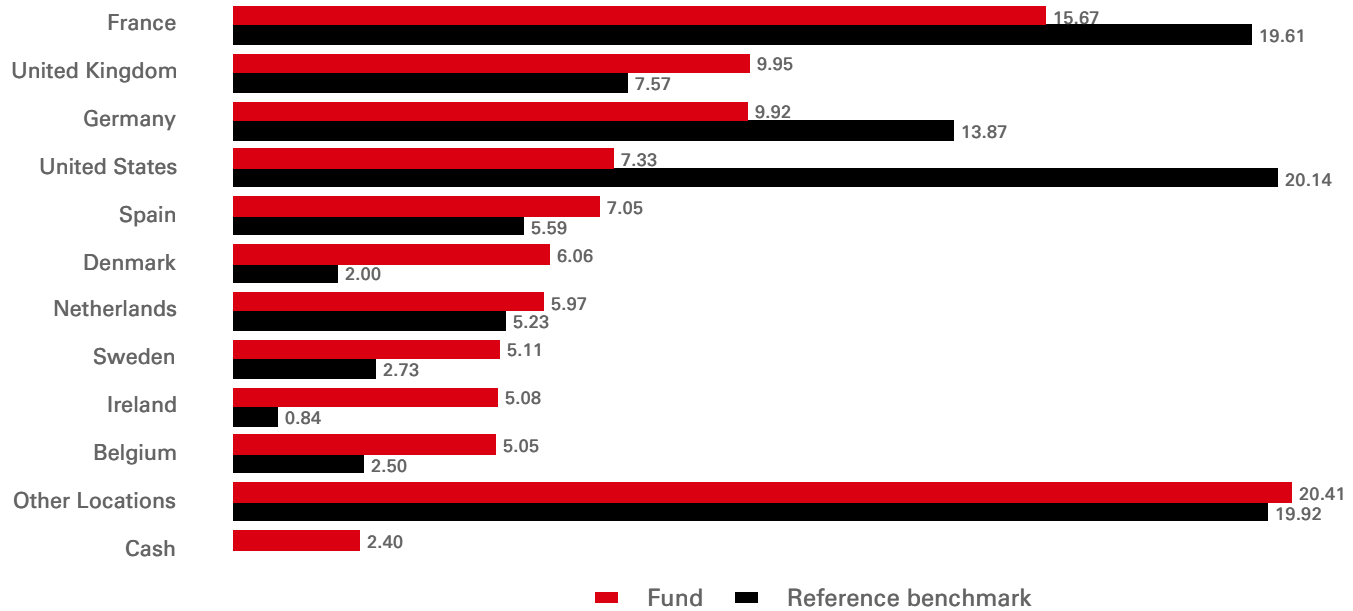
