Investment objective

The Fund aims to provide capital growth and income by investing in a diversified portfolio of investment grade rated bonds and other similar securities from around the world, while promoting environmental, social and governance (ESG) characteristics within the meaning of Article 8 of SFDR. The Fund aims to achieve a higher ESG score than its reference benchmark.

Investment strategy

The Fund is actively managed. The Fund will invest primarily in securities issued in developed markets and denominated in developed market currencies. The Fund may invest up to 20% in non-investment grade bonds and up to 20% in bonds issued in emerging markets. The Fund may invest up to 10% in bonds issued by any single government issuer with a non-investment grade rating. The Fund includes the identification and analysis of an issuer's environmental and social factors and corporate governance practices as an integral part of the investment decision making process. Issuers considered for inclusion within the Fund's portfolio will be subject to excluded activities in accordance with HSBC Asset Management's Responsible Investment Policies, which may change from time to time. The Fund may invest up to 10% in onshore Chinese bonds, invest up to 30% in asset backed securities and mortgage-backed securities, up to 10% in contingent convertible securities, may also invest in bank deposits and money market instruments for treasury purposes and up to 10% in other funds. Main risks

- The Fund's unit value can go up as well as down, and any capital invested in the Fund may be at risk.
- The Fund invests in bonds whose value generally falls when interest rates rise. This risk is typically greater the longer the maturity of a bond investment and the higher its credit quality. The issuers of certain bonds, could become unwilling or unable to make payments on their bonds and default. Bonds that are in default may become hard to sell or worthless.
- The Fund may invest in Emerging Markets, these markets are less established, and often more volatile, than developed markets and involve higher risks, particularly market, liquidity and currency risks.






